Element K

Element K provides software training, certified by Microsoft and Adobe, from your desktop. The Carpenter Library has purchased 500 subscriptions for Medical Center personnel, not to replace other training already in place, but rather as an alternate path for employees and students who are too busy to commit to a seven-hour class.

Element K breaks down application training into different levels. It does not force someone to start at level one and successively work through each subsequent level, but rather the user may start at any level within that course.

Several courses are designed specifically for Macintosh users. Different versions of software applications are also included, so that one may take training in Internet Explorer for version 5.5, as well as training for version 6.

You will receive an email with a code of alphanumeric characters (known as an Access Key) that will enable you to log onto the Element K website and register. Once you have registered, you will not need the Access Key again. Your account will remain active for 90 days from the time of your registration. At the end of the 90 day period, you will receive an email message whereby you can renew your account for another 90 days.

AccessMedicine.com from McGraw-Hill provides an online portal to many of the publisher's most popular medical titles: *Harrisons' Online*, *Hurst's The Heart*, the *AccessLANGE* series in the basic and clinical sciences, and the *Metabolic and Molecular Bases of Inherited Disease*. A new component is *Current Medical Diagnosis and Treatment* which will be updated quarterly rather than the standard annual updating in the print version. Users can create a personal profile which will allow you to download book excerpts to a PDA device, bookmark book sections and save them to your internet browser favorites list, email a book section to a colleague, and to receive email alerts when material is updated.



AccessMedicine users will also have access to GoldStandard Multimedia's Clinical Pharmacology. Clinical Pharmacology has over 2600 monographs covering over 95,000 drug products as well as patient information in English and Spanish. AccessMedicine also makes available self-evaluation instruments and lifelong learning tools such as online lectures, USMLE type questions, and peer-to-peer discussion.

All AccessMedicine books are listed on the electronic textbooks web page and can be searched by title. If you wish to search the entire AccessMedicine site, just click on the "Access" icon listed next to each AccessMedicine title on the electronic textbooks page.

is from Primal Products. This is another 3D product that allows the user to view and identify every layer of the body using animations and live action movies, in a fully interactive presentation. MRI views, radiology slides, dissection slides and biomechanics animations are also available. Quizzes allow you to test knowledge at your own pace.

An@tomy.tv has been licensed by the Library in an online version and can be found on the Library's Electronic Textbooks page.



Visible Human Dissector provides 3D photographic images of a human cadaver. Students can study the human structure with access to over 2000 anatomic structures presented in cross-sectional, systemic, clinical, surface, surgical, and regional views. Drs. James Johnson and Craig Henkel of Neurobiology and Anatomy are developing tutorials for their students using this program. The program can be found in the Library's Learning Resources Center in Classroom D.
