Objectives

Upon completion of the clinical preceptorship, you should be better able to:

- Match specific patients and procedures at your home institution to specific block approaches and specific regional anesthetic block techniques.
 - Make sound clinical decisions in the implementation and administration of **extended release epidural morphine** appropriate for your practice.
 - Make evidence-based selection of **local anesthetics**, doses, and adjuncts for nerve blockade in order to achieve the latency and duration you desire.
 - Purchase **equipment** appropriate for neuraxial blockade, peripheral nerve blockade, ambulatory infusions, ultrasound guidance, and nerve stimulation.
 - Describe the **infrastructure** (space, personnel, equipment, medical forms, patient preparation) needed to make regional anesthesia safe and successful.
 - Better understand the potential for benefit in the utilization of a **computer medical record** designed to facilitate the provision of regional anesthesia using a **systems based approach** to patient care.
 - Implement documentation practices with the intent to improve both **billing compliance** and patient care.

Overview

Wake Forest University Baptist Medical Center is an 980-bed teaching hospital with 40 operating rooms. The section of Regional Anesthesia and Acute Pain Management (RAAPM) is responsible for the provision of regional anesthetics and acute pain management throughout the hospital and for ambulatory patients.



We perform about 3500 peripheral nerve blocks, 2000 neuraxial blocks, 200 epidural administrations of extended release morphine, and 600 continuous peripheral blocks yearly. This activity occurs in our state-of-the-art six-bed RAAPM area built in 2008. Located within our OR suite, the RAAPM area is fully outfitted with the specific purpose of providing regional anesthesia and analgesia. Our routine practice includes nerve stimulating catheter techniques, ultrasound guided PNB, extended release epidural morphine, and ambulatory peripheral nerve block infusions. The RAAPM section manages these patients post-operatively using a systems-based approach to multimodal analgesia while employing a computer-based record for patient care and billing.

Target Audience

Clinicians, educators, and administrators who wish to develop new regional anesthesia practices and expand the scope of their techniques, establish or improve an acute pain service, and update their documentation and billing procedures are invited to attend.
