### BioMed Central

The Carpenter Library has recently purchased an institutional membership to BioMed Central for the School of Medicine, joining such institutions as Harvard, Columbia, Cornell, and the National Institutes of Health. BioMed Central provides free, full text access to all original research papers published in any of its 80+ online journals covering all areas of biology and medicine. Publishing with BioMed Central has a number of advantages including:

- Free access
- Authors retain copyright of their work
- Rapid peer review and publication
- High visibility
- Immediate indexing and archiving of articles to enable direct linking when they are cited in other journals.

### ILLiad Interlibrary Loan System

ILLiad is the library's new Interlibrary Loan/Document Delivery management system. Beginning in late February/early March, all requests for books and articles will be entered online. ILLiad allows you to track each request, as well as keep a running list of all transactions with Document Delivery.

ILLiad will be accessible through the Carpenter Library home page, from the "Quick Links" menu. You can set up an individual account that can be accessed from home or office. You will need to register only once. After entering the user name and password of your choice, you are ready to order. 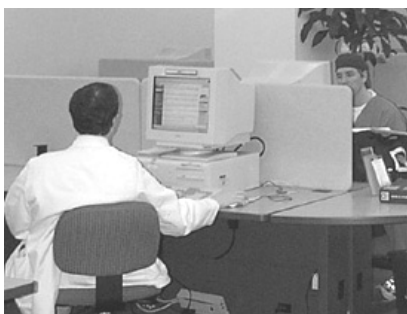
