It's That Time of Year!

The beginning of summer means the end of another fiscal year and time for the annual report from the Dean of the Medical School to the President of the University.

The Faculty Publications staff of the Library prepares a list of all publications (journal articles, books, book chapters, meeting abstracts, etc.) for each department for the annual report. We create a breakdown of the current year's numbers by department and by type of publication, as well as a table comparing the current year with the previous year's totals by publication type. This information comes from the Faculty Publications database, which is available via the Carpenter Library

Web page. You can search by author name, department, publication type, and/or year of publication. Another database, entitled Other Scholarly Activities, includes speeches, poster presentations, and elected and selected activities.

It is important that faculty submit all publications to the Carpenter Library staff so that the Dean can report a complete and accurate picture of WFUSM publishing.

New PubMed Features

E-mail Your Results

When you run a search in PubMed, you now have the option of emailing your results. From the "Send To" button, pick E-mail from the drop down menu, then click

In addition, you may enter a message that will be included with the PubMed search results.

After clicking the e-mail button, the system returns you to your results page and displays a message confirming that the e-mail message was sent. Your PubMed results are sent from the NCBI automatic mail server, [nobody@ncbi.nlm.nih.gov] with a "Subject" of PubMed Search Results. This is not a functioning customer service e-mail address.

If you choose HTML, your PubMed e-mail message displays as a PubMed results page and includes hyperlinks to Related Articles, LinkOut, and other PubMed features. The recipient's e-mail program must be set for HTML view in order to properly receive in HTML format.

New MESH Database

MeSH (Medical Subject Headings) is NLM's controlled vocabulary thesaurus and is used for indexing articles for MEDLINE. The MeSH Database is available from either the Search pull-down menu or the sidebar.

Use the MeSH database to find vocabulary terms to build a PubMed search strategy. The MeSH database can be searched by MeSH term, MeSH Entry Term, Subheading, Publication Type, or words within a MeSH Scope Note.

Troubleshooting Problems with Electronic Journals

Tip # 1 - Linking from PubMed

The Carpenter Library has established an account with the National Library of Medicine's Linkout project. This allows us to designate which full-text access articles are directly linked from a PubMed citation. The WFUSM icon appears when the link is available. We occasionally get calls regarding problems with these links.

Problem: I know we have this journal online but there is no icon in PubMed indicating a link. Not all publishers have a linking relationship with PubMed. You may know that a particular article is available through the Carpenter Library full-text, but do not see a link from PubMed. If you suspect that a title is available full-text, simply record the information you need from PubMed, and go to the electronic journals web page <http://www.wnt.wfubmc.edu/library/ejournals.asp> to see if the Library subscribes to the journal. Use citation information to locate your article from the publisher's page.

Problem: Sometimes the links in PubMed do not work. Library links are constructed with information provided by the full-text providers. Providers do not always provide correct links and sometimes there may be a problem with the subscription to that journal. Please report these problems to the Library by email mbarnett@wfubmc.edu or by phone at (336) 713-7100.

Problem: This journal had a full-text link before, now I don't see one. Library links are constructed from the links of a full-text provider. If a provider does not provide links to certain part of a journal, there won't be any links in those citations. Reasons for this vary. Full-text may not be ready for some citations, especially new ones. Letters and comments also may not be available as full-text. When this happens you may have better luck going directly to the journal web site (again through the Library's web page) and looking for the article that way.

Problem: Sometimes I see an icon in a citation that is not my library's. The icon you see is for the publisher who provides PubMed with the citation. It is our policy to display their icon. Our icon will display alongside this icon on citations that link to holdings at the library. Choose the Library's icon for guaranteed access.

Problem: I see the Library's icon, but when I try to link to the full-text, I am prompted for a password. The Library subscribes to more than 1300 electronic journals. Approximately 25 of these titles require a login and password for access. Please call the library if this happens at (336) 713-7100.

The Dorothy Carpenter Medical Archives maintains a list of the 53 portraits and busts that are seen throughout the Medical Center, such as Mr. Watlington on the first floor of Watlington Hall.

Currently, there are two portraits sitting on the floor of the Archives that need a permanent and public home. The Archivists need your help in finding a place to display them. Each portrait measures approximately 40 inches wide by 48 inches long. Like the other portraits in the Medical Center, there would be a framed biography (8½ by 11) of the person hanging next to the portrait.

The first portrait is of James Simpson Lynch, who was chairman of the Board of Trustees of NCBH from 1940-1946.

The second portrait is of Odus Mull, a 1902 Wake Forest College graduate. Mr. Mull is best known for securing the patronage of the Gray family to establish a medical school in Winston-Salem. A prominent lawyer and politician, Mr. Mull was a trustee of the hospital at the time of the Medical Center's inception. He served six terms in the North Carolina House of Representatives and was Speaker of the House in 1941, the same year the medical school opened in Winston-Salem as the Bowman Gray School of Medicine.

Library Survey 2003

In April, the Library surveyed its users by posting an electronic form on its web site. 237 surveys were completed. Not surprisingly, most said that access to journals was the number one reason to come to the Library whether physically or via the internet. Med students ranked “a place to study” as the number one reason they used the Library. Residents also listed Medline as another reason. All

Physician Assistant Student Orientation

The first week of June 2003 marked the beginning for 48 new PA students, now master's degree candidates. As part of their orientation, Carpenter Library spent some time acquainting students with some of the electronic resources and software packages students would have at their disposal during their 2½ year education. Pam Cabe introduced the electronic resources, (like the electronic textbooks collection) available from Carpenter Library's web page. David Stewart covered the many nuances of web searching and the best way to get accurate and quality search results. Janine Tillett introduced students to the PubMed database, which provides access to over 12 million MEDLINE citations back to the mid-1960's. Rochelle Kramer taught students the Reference Manager software package, which allows students to organize relevant citations from searches and automatically retrieves them for use in a paper or project.
